How Then Shall We Live?

In light of the drastically changed environment in which we are living what should Christians be doing; how should we live to honor our Lord? II Corinthians 10:3-4 reads, *For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war according to the flesh, for the weapons of our warfare are not of the flesh, but divinely powerful for the destruction of fortresses.* We are not to react to any situation including the current one in the way that the world does. It may seem to those outside the faith that we are not working against their efforts but when we follow the instructions we find in scripture just the opposite is true.

We live in a culture dominated by secularism. This is where most Americans are, this is how they function. Some are committed to secularism while others are that way simply by practice and custom. Whether on the left, the right or the muddled middle most people are part of a generation characterized by fear. But since we serve the one and only living God Christians we are not to follow the path of secularism. Sure we have things in common like breathing air and eating food but unlike non-believers our trust is in the Lord. In times of great difficulty and turmoil men turn to their gods, whether they are the one true God or false gods. There is great uncertainty in the general culture, not knowing who or what to trust. In that atmosphere we can and should offer a true word, the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

But in addition to the proclamation of the gospel what else must we be doing? First, we must think rightly about our situation. We must not equate our system of government with the kingdom of God. While at the founding of our nation the Christian faith was what most adhered to, while most of our leaders were Christians and while even those who were not believers still held our system of values and world view the representative democracy of the United States (though it was a good system of government) was not something to be worshiped. Often it has been said that our nation is the greatest nation in the world and in all of history. Even if that is true the people of God have our first and true allegiance to the one and only true God and not to any civil government. Jesus said our first commitment must be to Him and not to father and mother or anything else. In the crisis in which we find ourselves unbelievers stock up on the things they believe will help them, whether it be guns, food supplies or anything else. We too as believers should stock up, if we may use that phrase, on the things that will help us.

The first thing on our list is worship. Hebrews 10:25, *not forsaking our own assembling together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another; and all the more as you see the day drawing near.* Staying home in isolation is not the command of God, rather we are to worship Him in an acceptable manner, like Abel not Cain, and

we are to do so whenever we can. For surely the day of Christ's return is nearer than when the author of Hebrews penned those words.

The Second thing is to be honest with God about sin. Whether it is our thoughts or our deeds we need to confess our sin to God and repent of it. If we do not we will hardly be in a place to deal with all that is coming against us.

Number three, for all those who are married love and respect each other. Husbands are to love their wives as Christ loved the church, which means giving themselves for her. And wives are to love and respect their husbands. When a man and a woman marry they become one flesh. That relationship is more important than any relationship with any other human being. Marriage takes work, takes effort to succeed and if that happens the result is a united front against the onslaughts of Satan and his minions. A husband is a servant leader and the way he serves is by leading. Wives are to respect their husbands and love them while they are not to try to assume the God given responsibilities of their husband.

Fourth, music is important. In addition to the great hymns of the faith we should sing the songs that God gave us, that is the Psalms. The Psalms cover every aspect of life and are the musical accompaniment for our spiritual warfare. Remember that the Lord inhabits the praises of His people (Psalm 22:3). He loves it when what we sing are the words He has given us.

Fifth is hospitality and community. Romans 12:12-13 tells us that even in times of tribulation like the ones in which we find ourselves, we are still to practice hospitality. We are not to hole up in our homes with a bunker mentality but are instead to reach out to other believers. There is strength in numbers of like-minded people.

Sixth, Christian education is commanded in scripture. Fathers provoke not your children to wrath but bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. Our failure to do this is one of the key components in the deterioration of our culture.

Next, minimize the handles other people can use to try to control you by doing whatever you can to eliminate or at least minimize your debt. All of us have at one time or another bought things we wanted but did not need. Keeping those kind of purchases to a minimum will help your finances and keep you free from outside influences.

The joy of the Lord is your strength. Because we are His, our lives should be filled with joy. Nehemiah was in more difficult circumstances than we are, but it was he who encouraged the people when he said, "Eat the fat, drink the sweet and rejoice."

And lastly study. First and above all we need to study our Bibles. Regular reading and study of scripture will build you up in the faith. But also stay informed by reading other books. In summery honor God with everything you do and in every way you can knowing that He will be with you to strengthen you and help you because He cares for you.
